Monitors electrical equipment and system for operation condition and performance, including predictive and advanced diagnostic testing; preventive and corrective electrical maintenance used in collection, transmission, and treatment of water in a variety of facilities found in a water system and performs related duties as assigned.

### TYPICAL DUTIES

*May include, but are not limited to the following:*

Performs daily electrical/electronic preventative maintenance, repair of the District's water systems; motor controls, programmable logic controllers, industrial networking hardware, turbidity meters, electronic flow meters, pH meters, chlorine analyzers, automatic chemical and chlorination equipment.

**Certificate:** Possession of, or ability to obtain within one (1) year of appointment, a valid T2 Water Treatment Operator Certificate issued by the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB) and a valid D2 Distribution Operator Certificate issued by the State Water Resources Control Board (SWRCB). Possession of a valid California Water Environmental Association (CWEA) Electrical & Instrumentation Technologist Certification – Grade I, or an approved alternative is desirable.

### **License:**

Possession of, or ability to obtain within one (1) year of appointment, a valid Class A California Commercial driver's license with a Hazardous Materials endorsement is required, together with a satisfactory driving record.

A candidate selected for the position must successfully pass a pre-placement physical, which includes a drug and alcohol screening, and a criminal background check prior to employment. A successful candidate will be required to complete a verification form designated by the Department of Homeland Security (USCIS) that certifies they are eligible for employment in the United States.

## **OUR FOUNDATIONAL PRINCIPLES**

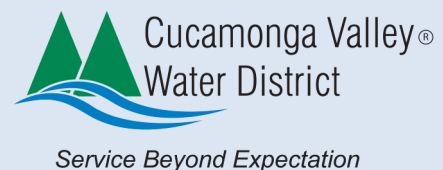
